Course Description	This course aims at A1 and A2 levels in English, as outlined by the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). The course content includes reading, listening and speaking components.
Course Aims and Objectives	This course aims to teach students to understand and use simple vocabulary, sentences, expressions, and basic phrases, introduce themselves, ask and answer questions about personal details and daily needs and read and understand simple information and texts.
	It also aims to teach students to understand and communicate in familiar situations; manage most situations related to living and travelling, to describe or express their opinion on topics of personal interest such as experiences, events, hopes and ambitions, and express opinions, reasons, and plans; read and understand information on familiar topics and write simple letters and text on familiar matter.
Course Learning Outcomes	<ul> <li>By the end of the course, students will be able to</li> <li>to understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type</li> <li>to introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has</li> <li>to interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help</li> <li>to understand and use simple vocabulary, sentences, expressions, and basic phrases</li> <li>to introduce themselves, ask and answer questions about personal details and daily needs – such as where they live, family information, shopping, eating, the local area, entertainment, and working</li> <li>to read and understand simple information and texts</li> </ul>
